FORT HUNTINGTON AND FORT HUNTINGTON PARK BY GAY A. CHRISTENSEN-DEAN



Fort Huntington was located west of the present county courthouse, at West 3rd Street and Lakeside in downtown Cleveland. It was built under the direction of President James Madison to protect the settlement during the War of 1812 against British naval attacks, and was the supply depot and headquarters of the Army of the Northwest.

At first, a camp was established in 1812 under the command of General Simon Perkins, and named Camp Harrison in honor of General William Henry Harrison, commander of the Army of the Northwest and future President. In 1813, Captain Stanton Sholes arrived at the camp and built a fort, stockade and hospital. It was renamed Fort Huntington after Samuel Huntington, Governor of Ohio from 1808-1810. Commodore Oliver Hazard Perry stopped at the fort before the Battle of Lake Erie, and returned there to celebrate his victory. In 1977, it was dedicated as Fort Huntington Park. First, it needed to be cleaned up, and there was also a fight between The Early Settlers Association and the City Commission as to its design. The Early Settlers Association won. In 1991, a statue of Oliver Hazard Perry was relocated to the park, and in 2002 a British naval cannon captured by Perry during the Battle of Lake Erie was dedicated. Every September at Fort Huntington Park, The Early Settlers Association commemorates Commodore Oliver Hazard Perry's victory in the Battle of Lake Erie.
